

### Introduction to Kiln-formed Glass

Students explore the possibilities of kiln-formed glass as they learn the basics of glass cutting, firing schedules, glass compatibility, and annealing. Participants experiment with design possibilities using a wide variety of frit, stringers, confetti, and iridized glass to create a set of "Time & Temperature" tiles, a fused and slumped bowl, and several other projects. Both the technical and artistic sides of the medium of fused glass are shown. A \$100 materials fee is payable to the instructor. This workshop is held off-site at the instructor's studio in Maryland.

### Pop-Up Books: Beyond the Fold I

Making pop-ups involves trial and error and a sense of play. Students begin to understand how strategically placed folds and lower flaps, causing a specific effect. Participants make "working models" of each pop-up taught, and learn the magic behind each motion. The instructor collects a \$20 materials fee to cover the cost of consumable supplies.


### Quick Portrait Painting

Students will learn a quick portrait technique using alkyd oil medium with an acrylic under-painting to create a completed quick portrait in 8 hours. Students will begin by sketching a fellow student with watercolor pencils on a tinted canvas or panel. They will then use porous acrylic paint for the under-painting. After preparing the under-painting with clear gesso, students will use alkyd oil paint to complete the painting. A \$20 materials fee is payable to the instructor who will supply the porous acrylic paint, clear gesso and alkyd medium.

## Shape Painting in Watercolor

This workshop focuses on analyzing the subject matter for its shape content and then, working from this foundation, creating a work of art. A variety of helpful techniques and exercises, including cropping, choosing brushes versus paper size, contrasting and analogous colors, and the placement of dark and light values are covered. Resource materials include: student and instructor photographs, and still life set-ups.

## Alternative Photo Process

In this hands-on workshop, participants learn some of the lesser-known photo processes. The image and emulsion transfer process did not die with Polaroid. This course covers how to take images, manipulate them, and put on almost any surface using Fuji's instant print film. The world of the cyanotype and its beautiful blue, turn-of-the-century look is also explored. Students also make their own pinhole cameras and take photos with them. All materials are supplied but students are encouraged to bring their own slides, images, and materials on which to transfer images. A \$40 lab fee is payable to the instructor.

In addition to studying the plant and blossom, instruction includes the background wash, and typically associated subjects such as birds, rocks, butterflies, and bees.

## Perspective Drawing

Many artists cite “perspective” as one of the most difficult challenges to overcome when setting up a composition. In this workshop, students enhance their ability for critical observation as they learn the rules of perspective, perspective measurement, division of shapes into an even or odd number of spaces, circles in perspective, and inclined planes. This knowledge can then be applied to real drawing situations and used to create clear spatial order within pictures.

## Woodfiring Workshop

Participate first hand in the magic of firing pots in a wood kiln! This is a unique opportunity to experience the entire process of firing a woodfired salt kiln as pots are naturally decorated by the flames, wood ash, and salt. Students begin by loading the kiln on Saturday morning and allowing it to preheat through the night. The main firebox is lit early Sunday morning and finishes Sunday evening. Along with a lot of shared food and conversation, Blair and Allison place a strong emphasis on their glazing, stacking, stoking, and salting techniques. Kiln space determines workshop price: a half share is 12” X 24” X 9” at \$75; a whole share is 24” X 24” X 9” at \$125. This workshop is held offsite at the instructors’ studio in Maryland.

## The Ins and Outs of Anatomy

Working with a model, participants analyze the anatomic structure of the human body as they sculpt beginning inside with the bone structure and work outward adding the muscles and features. This classical technique for studying anatomy is beneficial to sculptors, drawers, or painters interested in creating an accurate depiction of the figure. Along with instructor demonstration, anatomy books lend to the learning process, and students alternate between drawing and sculpting to achieve the goals of the class. Clay is included.
