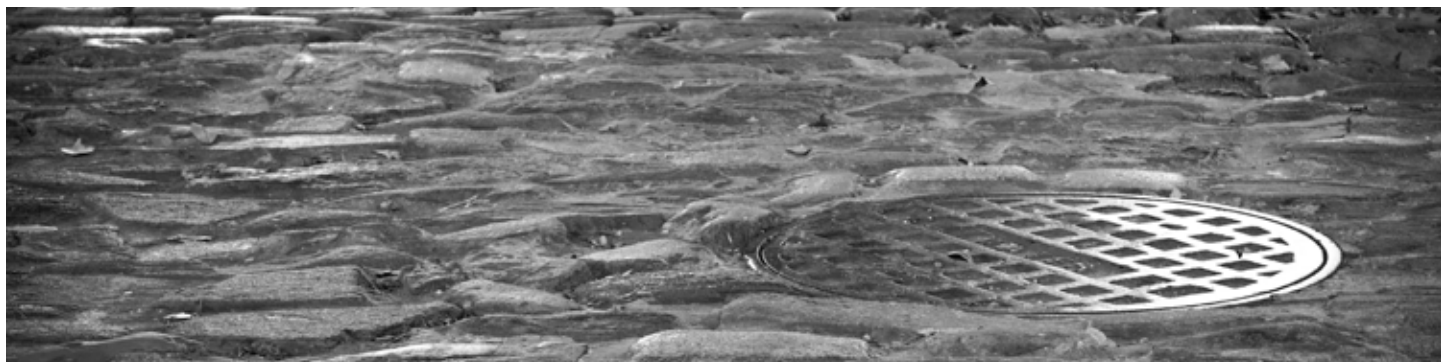

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## Introduction to Kiln-formed Glass

Students explore the possibilities of kiln-formed glass as they learn the basics of glass cutting, firing schedules, glass compatibility, and annealing. Participants experiment with design possibilities using a wide variety of frit, stringers, confetti, and iridized glass to create a set of "Time & Temperature" tiles, a fused and slumped bowl, and several other projects. Both the technical and artistic sides of the medium of fused glass are shown. A \$100 materials fee is payable to the instructor. ## Crash Course in Drawing

## Photographing Your Artwork

This workshop covers the basics of taking images of artwork for gallery submission, website use, or print reproduction. Lighting, lens use, backdrops, film and digital options are explored. Both 2-D and 3-D artwork are discussed. Participants should bring a camera (film or digital) that can be operated in full manual mode and notebook. No artwork needed.

### **Color in Still Life**

This intensive course focuses on how to see and utilize color in still life painting. Using the works of Cotan, Chardin, Peto, Manet, Cezanne, and other masters as guides, this workshop explores how to use color, value, temperature, complementaries, and analogous relationships to compose and strengthen still life painting skills. ### **Jumpstart in Watercolor**

New students get a chance to try some of watercolor's many possibilities through a series of painting projects. ### **Painting the Beauty of Fall**

Artists learn to organize color by painting two fall scenes; one mainly in yellows, the other in a variety of reds. Discussions include creating mood with color, color compliments, and techniques for painting trees, grasses, and other subjects in the fall landscape. Each class begins with a demonstration, followed by work-time and individual help, and ends with a critique. Students work from sketches and photos.

### **Silver Jewelry: Link Bracelet**

This workshop introduces students to the very basics of jewelry making and silver soldering. Students make and finish a simple link bracelet and clasp in sterling silver and are able to wear it home! Techniques covered include fabrication, forming, soldering, hammer texturing, and polishing. Materials and use of tools and equipment is included. No previous experience necessary. A \$25 materials fee is payable to the instructor. This class takes place at National Harbor.

### **From Amateur to Professional**

This very intensive workshop demystifies the business side of being a professional artist. ### **Unraveling the Secrets of Silk**

Silk has been the luxurious companion of felters, papermakers, and fiber artists for centuries. This workshop explores the endless possibilities of silk cocoons and silk fabrics through the techniques of unraveling, stretching, degumming, dyeing, embossing, devoré, and felting. Tuition includes all materials.

### **Jumpstart into Abstract & Non-Objective Painting**

Participants develop an intuitive process with acrylics and mixed media such as crayons, charcoal, and collage. This course offers the freedom of using color, line, form, and texture as the subject art. Demonstrations and challenging assignments teach all levels of painters to create, edit, and redesign a multi-layered artwork that may suggest a recognizable form (abstract) or be without a recognizable subject (non-objective).

### **Architectural Photography**

Learn the elements of good architectural photography—perspective, scale, lighting, and composition in this two day outdoor workshop. Class begins with a field trip in Old Town Alexandria on day one and half of day two. Shooting at night is also discussed. A classroom demonstration for the last half of the second day covers post-production in Photoshop. Both film and digital cameras are accepted.

## Crash Course in Spinning

Students are introduced to the fundamentals of spinning in this intensive weekend session. Spinning wheel techniques to be featured include drafting, spinning, and finishing both single and 2-ply yarns. Choosing the right wheel, measuring, using handcards and the drum carder, and gauging the grist of yarn are also covered. A school wheel or personal wheel may be used. Some practice time is available in the studio. A \$10 materials fee is payable to the instructor.

## Perspective Drawing

Many artists cite "perspective" as one of the most difficult challenges to overcome when setting up a composition. In this workshop, students enhance their ability for critical observation as they learn the rules of perspective, perspective measurement, division of shapes into an even or odd number of spaces, circles in perspective, and inclined planes. This knowledge can then be applied to real drawing situations and used to create clear spatial order within pictures.

## Introduction to Encaustic

Participants learn to paint with encaustic, a mixture of beeswax and pigment. This course covers basic techniques of painting and fusing, transparent and opaque layering, scribing, image transfer, combining oil paint and wax, collage, tools, recommended supports, and safety concerns. The workshop consists of demonstrations and hands-on experience. Workshop fee includes materials, four supports, and use of equipment.

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## Structural Figure Drawing

Dan Thompson

This drawing workshop is presented as a way of analyzing the figure in a long-posed drawing or painting situation. In part one, the figure is set-up as a two-day long pose, and work begins on gesture, proportion, shape, and tone. In part two the human figure is analyzed by creating a simple diagram of the components of the figure in space. This diagram is then developed according to the concerns of plane, rhythm, perspective, and constructive anatomy. Modeling and shading are explored in the on-going drawing.

## Capturing the Plein-Air View: DC from Above

Capture the spectacular views of Washington, DC from U Street! Isabella Spicer hosts artists on her furnished rooftop. Mike Francis guides participants through the creative process, as they develop a series of studies that may be expanded upon in their studio or within the instructor's other courses. The complexity of the subject matter lends itself to the monotype. Some experience is preferred. Students supply all materials, including easels.
